Members throughout the Society embrace the Supporting Early-career Educators project in a variety of ways. The top three types of support reported for the 2012-14 biennium included:

- Collection of supplies and gift cards for early-career educators
- One-to-one mentoring and support in classroom situations
- Welcome bags for new educators at start of school (with DKG materials inserted)

Approximate number of hours spent on SEE during 2012-2014: 52,654.75

EEC Biennial Update

This summer marks the midpoint of the 2013-2015 state organization biennium and the start of a new biennium for chapters. Just as educators use midterms and exams to evaluate the progress of students, DKG committees use reports to determine where chapters and state organizations are in embracing goals, ideas and materials developed for their use. The EEC 2012-2014 Biennial Report submitted in March provides evidence of what chapters and state organizations are doing to support Educational Excellence across the Society. Here's info the reports yielded:

(Percentages noted throughout this issue indicate % of total chapters reporting.)

Goal 1: Advance excellence in education

Components of this goal receiving the most recognition by chapters included:

- Programs promoting educational excellence (80.3%)
- "Hot Topics" in education (68.08%)
- Programs supporting the SEE project (65.75%)

Based on these results, areas of focus for strategic planning might include:

- Programs/activities impacting educational law and policy
- Programs addressing pedagogical research

Goal 2: Empower women

Components of this goal receiving the most recognition by chapters included:

- Personal growth of women/life-long learning (85.01%)
- Professional pride (72.41%)
- Arts, music and the humanities (71.8%)

Based on these results, an area of focus for strategic planning might include community leadership.



Goal 3: Increase global awareness

The component under this goal receiving the most recognition by chapters was:

Programs/activities designed to increase global awareness (56.5%)

Based on these results, areas of focus for strategic planning might include:

- Programs/activities focusing on the DKG/UN relationship
- · Programs that inform and support the Schools for Africa (SFA) project

State organizations and chapters can use this information as it applies to their situations to continue what works and address areas where more work may be needed.
